Beat 123 has consistently leaded the district in robberies for a number of years. There have been 49 robberies year to date in 2020, which is similar to 2019. During the 2019 calendar year, 66 robberies were reported, compared to 61 in 2018. These numbers and the effects they have caused on the community are why we picked this as a priority.
