Of those reported incidents several occurred within the boundaries of our top Gang Conflict Zones in 2020. According to current statistics, Beat 321 has the highest number of shootings with a total of (26) as of 29 October 2020. This time last year Beat 321 had 12 shootings. Our goal is to reduce the number of Gang Related Calls For Service which will ultimately assist with mitigating crimes associated with gang activity in 2021 in the identified area of concern.
