Reported robberies, 38 in total, thus far for the 2020 year are running parallel with the 2019 year. During the 2019 calendar year, 50 robberies were reported, compared to 47 in 2018. This was a dramatic decrease compared to 80 reported in 2017 and 94 in 2016. The reported number of car jacking's thus far in 2020 are 7. This represents a 133% increase compared to the same period for 2019 and 28.6% increase to 2018.
