Preliminary Statement of Police-Involved Shooting in the 3100 block of E. 83rd St.

CHICAGO – On Monday, May 11, 2026, at approximately 10:35 p.m., 4th (South Chicago) District Chicago Police tactical officers responded to a person with a gun call in the 8200 block South Shore Dr. Officers attempted to conduct an investigatory stop with a person who matched the description of the offender. Officers approached the offender in the 3100 block of E. 83rd St., attempted to de-escalate, and provided direction for him to keep his hands visible. There was an exchange of gunfire, and both officers discharged their service weapons, striking the offender about the body. Officers immediately called for an ambulance and rendered aid on scene. The offender was placed into custody and transported to the University of Chicago, where he was listed in serious condition. A firearm was recovered on the scene. No officers were struck by gunfire. Both officers were transported to a local hospital for observation.

Currently, the specifics of this incident, including the comprehensive use of force investigation, are being investigated by the Civilian Office of Police Accountability with the full cooperation of the Chicago Police Department.

The officer(s) involved will be placed on routine administrative duties for a minimum period of 30 days. This matter remains under investigation, and all further inquiries can be directed to the Civilian Office of Police Accountability at (312) 746-3609.
