Preliminary Statement on Police-Involved Shooting in the 1400 block of W. Argyle Street.

CHICAGO – On June 15, 2026, at approximately 8:22 p.m., Chicago Police Officers assigned to the 20th District (Lincoln) were on patrol when they heard a call of shots fired. Preliminary investigation indicates the victim, a 63-year-old male, was involved in a verbal altercation with a known male offender. During the altercation, the offender produced a firearm and fired shots, striking the victim multiple times in the body. The victim was transported to Illinois Masonic Hospital, where he was later pronounced. The offender fled northbound on foot from the 4800 block of N. Clark Street and was located by responding officers at the 1400 block of W. Argyle Street.

A brief foot pursuit ensued, at which time the offender turned and raised his firearm in the direction of officers. Officers discharged their service weapons and struck the male offender. The officers immediately rendered aid. The offender was transported to St. Francis Hospital where he is listed in critical condition. A firearm was recovered on scene. Three officers were transported to a local hospital for observation and are listed in good condition. The Investigative Response Team is investigating the circumstances involving the incident. The Civilian Office of Police Accountability was notified. The investigation is ongoing.

The officer(s) involved will be placed on routine administrative duties for a minimum period of 30 days. This matter remains under investigation and all further inquiries can be directed to the Civilian Office of Police Accountability at (312) 746-3609.
