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Preliminary Statement on Police-Involved Shooting in the 900 block of E. 100th St.

CHICAGO – On Thursday, March 20, 2025, at approximately 7:04 a.m., Chicago Police officers assigned to the 5th (Calumet) District responded to a domestic-related call of a male with a gun. On scene, officers entered a residence, where they encountered an armed male offender and female victim inside a bedroom. As the officer attempted to de-escalate, the female victim was able to flee the room. As the offender pointed the firearm in the direction of the officer, the officer fired their weapon, striking the offender. Officers immediately called for EMS for the offender, who was transported to University of Chicago Hospital and later pronounced. A weapon was recovered on scene. The female victim who was inside the residence at the time of the incident was also transported to a hospital for treatment. One officer was transported to a nearby hospital for observation. The Investigative Response Team is on the scene investigating

Currently, the specifics of this incident, including the comprehensive use of force investigation, are being investigated by the Civilian Office of Police Accountability with the full cooperation of the Chicago Police Department.

The officer(s) involved will be placed on routine administrative duties for a minimum period of 30 days. This matter remains under investigation and all further inquiries can be directed to the Civilian Office of Police Accountability at (312) 746-3609.

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
