Preliminary Statement on Police-Involved Shooting in the 2900 block of W. 47th St.

CHICAGO – On Saturday, April 25, 2026, at approximately 1:12 a.m., 9th (Deering) District Chicago Police tactical officers attempted to conduct an investigatory stop on a vehicle occupied by two males and one female in the 4400 block of S. Mozart Ave. The offenders fled in the vehicle and fired multiple times at the police vehicle. The police pursued the offending vehicle, which crashed in the 2900 block of W. 47th St, where the offenders fled on foot. At this time, an offender produced a firearm, fired at officers, and one officer discharged their weapon. No one was struck by gunfire. Offenders were transported to local hospitals with minor injuries caused by the traffic crash. One officer was transported to a local hospital for observation. Three offenders were taken into custody, and two firearms were recovered on scene. The Investigative Response Team is on-scene.

Currently, the specifics of this incident, including the comprehensive use of force investigation, are being investigated by the Civilian Office of Police Accountability with the full cooperation of the Chicago Police Department.

The officer(s) involved will be placed on routine administrative duties for a minimum period of 30 days. This matter remains under investigation, and all further inquiries can be directed to the Civilian Office of Police Accountability at (312) 746-3609.
