CHICAGO POLICE DEPARTMENT ANNOUNCES COMMAND STAFF PROMOTION

CHICAGO — Chicago Police Department (CPD) Superintendent Larry Snelling today announced the promotion of Deputy Director Tim Moore to Chief of the Bureau of Internal Affairs.

Chief Moore is now responsible for all operations within the Bureau of Internal Affairs, which conducts investigations into allegations of misconduct by members of CPD to reach complete and fair conclusions.

"Chief Moore moves into this role with nearly two decades of experience within the Bureau of Internal Affairs," said Superintendent Snelling. "He has a proven track record of conducting complete, thorough and impartial investigations, and I know he will lead the bureau with the same integrity he has displayed throughout his career."

Chief of the Bureau of Internal Affairs - Timothy Moore

Chief Moore, a 31-year member of the Department, will serve as Chief of the Bureau of Internal Affairs. As the Chief, he oversees all operations within the bureau, including all internal investigations and accountability reforms related to the consent decree. He brings a wealth of experience into this position, including his return to the bureau as its Deputy Director after retiring as a Commander in 2021. He also served the bureau as a Lieutenant after first serving as a Sergeant beginning in 2006. From 2014 to 2020, he was also a member of the FBI's Anti-Corruption Taskforce. He also served as a Sergeant in the Area One Detective Division, the FBI's Joint Terrorism Task Force and the 3rd (Grand Crossing) District. Chief Moore holds a master's degree in Business Management from Saint Xavier University and a bachelor's degree in Law Enforcement Administration from Western Illinois University.
