• The root cause of this issue is the gathering of large groups of vehicles in vacant parking lots and intersections throughout the 8th District. Each weekend, several hundred vehicles from various parts of the city and suburbs gather at a pre-determined location and time. While these vehicles travel to and from the meeting points, they drive in a dangerous and reckless manner.

Response Strategy

Non-enforcement response (required):

- Identify and create city service requests for tree trimming and street light repairs along Pulaski to
 ensure that the pedestrians have a safe and well-lit walking path. This will also maintain clear sight
 lines for surveillance cameras.
- Identify the meeting locations and work with the property owners to create a strategy to deter future meeting.
- Utilize social media and news affairs to spread awareness.

- Since there was such a dramatic increase in calls for service for drag racing (+204%) in the target area from 2021 to 2022, the overall goal will be to see a large decrease in related calls for service during 2023. The issue will be addressed when we see a consistent decrease over a long period.
- In order to truly determine whether this priority has been addressed, we will have to gauge the community that resides and works in the affected area. By attending community meetings and events and monitoring social media posts, we will truly be able to determine if community members feel comfortable living and working in the neighborhood without fear of becoming a victim.
