Quantitatively, this involves a decline in the number of shootings, as measured by data from the SDSC room, tactical missions, and Shot Spotter alerts, compared to the previous year's statistics.

Qualitatively, it will be considered addressed when there is a noticeable improvement in the community's perception of safety, as reflected in resident feedback and reduced fear of gun violence. Additionally, successful community engagement, trust-building, and increased participation in neighborhood programs will indicate a qualitative improvement in the overall well-being of the community, signifying progress in addressing the issue of shootings.
