Be as specific as possible.</i>	<p>While Robberies in the District are down from last year, one of the key concerns from the community were still Robberies. 39% of the robberies in the 014th District occurred on Beat 1434, 1424, and 1433. The vast majority of the robberies in this area (69%) occurred in public (street, sidewalk, alley, park and parking lot) with the remaining occurring in commercial business locations and on the CTA. Data from CompStat, Caboodle, and Tableau showed that 32% of the robberies occurred between the hours 2000- 0059hrs in this area.</p>

Include any identified patterns such as motives, types of weapons used to commit the crime, how they attempt to flee the scene of the crime, etc.</i></p> <p>A majority of the robberies occurring in public, the offender/s are arriving in stolen motor vehicles. This information is based on the license plates given by victims and witnesses as well as captured license plates from cameras in the area at the time of occurrence. The 014th District had over 500 motor vehicle thefts this year. In a vast majority of the robberies, the offenders are armed with handguns, commit the robbery and flee in the said stolen vehicle.</p>

A majority of the burglary/thefts on Beat 1433 occur near the Salt Shed and Goose Island Pop up space on Le Moyne.

Vehicle owners are parking their vehicles a couple blocks away from the places they are patronizing. This allows offenders to commit the burglaries/thefts with few witnesses or anyone hearing them break into the vehicles.





