Be as specific as possible.</i>	<p>In 2025, the 017th District has experienced a significant reduction in shooting violence. Shooting incidents are down 62%, and homicides have decreased by 50% compared to 2024. Year-to-date, the district has recorded 12 shooting incidents, a notable drop from the 31 reported during the same period last year.</p> <p>While these numbers reflect meaningful progress, reducing violence will continue to remain a top priority for the men and women of the 017th District, as safeguarding human life is our highest mission. As in previous years, gang activity and the presence of illegal handguns remain the primary drivers of these incidents.</p>

Include any identified patterns such as motives, types of weapons used to commit the crime, how they attempt to flee the scene of the crime, etc.</i></p> <p>Gun violence within the area is still predominantly carried out through drive-by shootings, vehicle-to-vehicle incidents, and assaults in which offenders approach victims on foot. In most cases, offenders flee the scene by vehicle, and when license plate information is available, the majority of these vehicles are confirmed to have been reported stolen. Consistent with previous years, social media continues to be a significant catalyst for gang-related disputes and remains a critical focus of district monitoring efforts.</p>

<p>Challenges contributing to ongoing violence include correctional facilities not detaining repeat offenders and the increased reliance on electronic monitoring, internal and external gang conflicts, poverty and unemployment, and a persistent lack of community resources.</p>

Non-enforcement strategies must be included.</i></p>	<p><i>Non-enforcement response (required):</i></p> <p>The district will continue to facilitate information sharing between the SDSC and roll-call personnel, actively participate in beat and block association meetings, and collaborate with community organizations to support youth and family engagement as well as educational initiatives. Additionally, all graffiti removal requests, lighting repairs, and other municipal concerns will be submitted through 311 and routed to the appropriate city departments. Any incidents of domestic-related gun violence will receive immediate follow-up from the Domestic Violence Liaison Officer (DVLO), with a range of support services offered to affected individuals.</p>				
	<p><i>Enforcement response (if applicable):</i></p> <p>The 017th District Tactical Teams, consisting of up to 30 Officers and three Sergeants, will maintain their dedicated missions while adapting operations to address emerging trends identified through data analysis. Additionally, the 06 Team will remain a key resource, focusing on priority concerns within the 017th District. SDSC personnel will continue to conduct POD missions. A primary concern raised by the community is the increase in traffic violations, which may contribute to additional criminal activity within the district. To address this, our officers will prioritize proactive traffic enforcement and request supplementary support from the Traffic Unit to strengthen our overall crime-reduction efforts.</p>				
<p><b>Root Cause Mitigation</b> <i>Explain how the Response Strategy directly addresses the root cause that was analyzed above.</i></p>	<p>The district shall maintain active engagement with organizations committed to family and youth development, with the objective of cultivating leadership, promoting social reform, and advancing the overall welfare of the community. Roll calls will be conducted with a deliberate focus on specific criminal activity or emerging issues, thereby enabling Officers to concentrate efforts effectively while fostering constructive community interaction. In addition, all 311 service requests will be systematically processed through the appropriate Aldermanic offices, ensuring accountability, preserving community standards, and addressing minor concerns proactively to prevent their escalation into more significant challenges.</p>

Such engagement empowers residents to assume leadership roles in collaborative problem-solving alongside their neighbors. Furthermore, community members are urged to continue to report incidents directly to 911, rather than relying solely on Aldermanic offices or social media platforms, to ensure timely and effective law enforcement response.</p>

Be as specific as possible.</i>	<p>Although robberies within the district have declined by 44% compared to the prior year, they continue to represent a key concern for the community. While such incidents occur throughout the district, the greatest concentration is observed within the boundaries of 1722 and 1723. The majority of robberies in these areas take place on public thoroughfares, with the remainder affecting the business community. Analysis of Caboodle and CompStat data indicates that the majority of reported robberies occur between 2100 and 0200 hours.</p>

<b>Problem Analysis</b> <i>Explain the problem by describing each of the listed elements. Be as specific as possible.</i>		<p>5. <i>Describe the methods / actions used by the offender (do not include demographic information). Include any identified patterns such as motives, types of weapons used to commit the crime, how they attempt to flee the scene of the crime, etc.</i></p> <p>The majority of robberies occurring in public areas involve offenders arriving in stolen motor vehicles. This determination is based on license plate information provided by victims and witnesses, as well as data obtained from area surveillance cameras at the time of the incidents. In a substantial proportion of these cases, offenders are armed with handguns, carry out the robbery, and subsequently flee in the identified stolen vehicle.</p>

Be as specific as possible.</i></p>	<p>The 017<sup>th</sup> district is bound by a commercial shopping corridor alongside a densely populated residential area, strategically located in proximity to a major expressway. The majority of robberies are opportunistic in nature, with offenders frequently targeting retail establishments due to their prevalence within the area along with a heavy population of citizens on the public way</p>

Non-enforcement strategies must be included.</i></p>	<p><i>Non-enforcement response (required):</i></p> <p>The district will continue to conduct beat meetings and engage with neighborhood associations to provide updates on crime patterns and issue community alerts. Additionally, the district will collaborate closely with the local Chamber of Commerce to disseminate alerts and reach a broad business audience. Efforts will be made to educate and inform targeted groups, enhancing awareness and fostering community-wide participation in crime prevention initiatives.</p>		
	<p><i>Enforcement response (if applicable):</i></p> <p>The district will augment police presence within the area through the deployment of Tactical Teams and the implementation of foot patrol operations. A significant concern expressed by the community is the escalation in traffic violations, which may serve as a contributing factor to additional criminal activity, including robberies, within the district. In response, the district will emphasize rigorous, proactive traffic enforcement and formally request augmented support from the Traffic Unit to further strengthen and sustain our comprehensive crime-reduction strategy. These initiatives are specifically designed to suppress criminal activity and are further supported by the strategic utilization of Automated License Plate Readers (ALPR) on beat vehicles operating within the district.</p>		
<p><b>Root Cause Mitigation</b> <i>Explain how the Response Strategy directly addresses the root cause that was analyzed above.</i></p>	<p>By providing education to residents and business owners, the district aims to reduce the likelihood of victimization. Maintaining consistent communication is essential, including the dissemination of safety guidance and preventive measures. Intelligence on crime trends, as well as issued crime and business alerts, will be shared through social media platforms to ensure timely awareness and community preparedness.</p>

Community members expressed ongoing concerns regarding residential and commercial burglaries, noting that these offenses create lasting fear, financial loss, and distrust within neighborhoods. In addition, burglary patterns often indicate repeat offenders and can be linked to broader criminal activity within the district.</p> <p>Community feedback, combined with crime data, demonstrated that addressing burglary trends would have a meaningful impact on reducing overall crime and improving neighborhood stability. As a result, burglaries were again prioritized to allow for focused enforcement, targeted prevention strategies, and strengthened collaboration between residents, patrol officers, and investigative units.</p>
