Preliminary Statement on Police Involved Shooting– 3300 block of W. Monroe

CHICAGO – On January 15, 2017, at approximately 12:23 a.m., 11th (Harrison) District Officers were on routine patrol in the vicinity of the 3400 block of W. Madison, when they heard several loud reports. Officers responded to the area where the shots emanated from and observed an offender fleeing the scene. Officers initiated a foot pursuit during which the offender ran to an alley near the 3300 block of W. Monroe and confronted them with a weapon. As a result of this action, one of the pursuing Officers discharged his weapon striking the offender multiple times. Officers subsequently rendered aid to the offender and requested emergency medical services.

Officers did not sustain injuries during the incident. The offender was transported to an area hospital for treatment. A weapon was recovered on the scene.

During the course of the investigation a 51-year-old female was discovered shot on the 3400 block of W. Madison. The victim was transported to an area hospital with a gunshot wound to the chest and is listed in stable condition. There may be a second female shooting victim associated with this incident.

Currently, the specifics of this incident, including the comprehensive use of force investigation are being investigated by the Independent Police Review Authority with the full cooperation of the CPD.

The officer(s) involved will be placed on routine administrative duties for a period of 30 days.
