

The Internal Affairs Division has the responsibility to investigate those allegations involving complaints of employee misconduct not specific to the investigation by the Independent Police Review Authority. These allegations include but are not limited to; criminal misconduct, operational violations, substance abuse, and off-duty incidents that warrant department oversight.

The following data reflects those cases that were investigated by the Internal Affairs Division and does not include those cases that were Administratively Closed.

TOP FIVE ALLEGATIONS IN 2010


