

CHICAGO POLICE DEPARTMENT: JUNE 2024 IN REVIEW

CPD Announces Department Efforts, Citywide Crime Statistics for June 2024



This month, the Chicago Police Department continued preparing for the upcoming 2024 Democratic National Convention. A major component of this long-term planning and preparation includes specialized training for every officer that is based in the sanctity of human life, constitutional policing and deescalation, while always protecting those exercising their First Amendment Rights.

"With the 2024 Democratic National Convention fast approaching, our officers are continuing to receive training rooted in constitutional policing," said Superintendent Larry Snelling. "We have been planning for the DNC for more than a year and are ready to protect the areas

around the convention footprint, as well as our entire city."

Officers also remain dedicated to enhancing public safety and growing community trust. CPD's <u>Crime Victim Services Program</u> hosted two Emergency Assistance Centers this month for all those affected by violent crime, providing comprehensive support to help our community heal and recover. This program will continue all summer long, with services available every Wednesday at local libraries.

The Department also teamed up with local organizations for two gun turn-in events, where 174 firearms and 64 replicas were collected, no questions asked. This month, officers have recovered 1,276 firearms – an average of more than 42 firearms each day and 25.3% ahead of last June – and 6,109 firearms since the beginning of 2024, slightly ahead of last year's pace.

The first week of June was recently recognized by the Illinois Association of Chiefs of Police as the inaugural Law Enforcement Civilian Personnel Appreciation Week. CPD honored our civilian members and their hard work in roles like Victim Advocates, Area Coordinators, Detention Aides and Mental Health Clinicians and Professional Counseling Division staff. These members, among others, are an integral part of the Chicago Police Department, and we thank them for their hard work and support each day.

Department members took part in many events this month, including the 53rd Annual Pride Parade and the 46th Annual Puerto Rican People's Day Parade, the 20th anniversary of the Ride to Remember and the 2024 Juneteenth West Fest & Basketball Tournament. Members of CPD's Honor Guard also escorted three World War II veterans to Normandy to commemorate the 80th anniversary of D-Day, while we all celebrated the dedicated dads and father figures in our lives this Father's Day.

JUNE 2024 CRIME STATISTICS

- Citywide, there were 67 murders this month, 4.2% below than June 2023 and the lowest June figure in five years.
- Overall, homicides are down 12.2% year to date. There's a 5.8% drop in shooting incidents and a 3.2% decline in the number of shooting victims. All are the lowest since 2019.
- Through June, the homicide clearance rate is 60.89%, the highest, year to date, since at least 2015.
- Through the first half of the year, the city has recorded 483 vehicular hijackings, down 16% compared to 2023. Officers have made 875 motor vehicle-related arrests. Of the 118 arrests for vehicular hijacking, which is 11% higher than this time last year, 43% have been juvenile offenders.
- Motor vehicle thefts are have dropped 22.4% this month and 25% year to date. So far this year, robberies with a firearm are down 9.9% and there's an 11.5% decline month to date.
- Based on Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR) figures, overall Part 1 crimes have fallen 6% month to date and 4% compared to this time last year, while property crimes are down 9% over June 2023 and 6% year to date.
- Overall transit crime is has declined 9% month to date and 2% compared to this time last year, while property crime on the CTA is down 31% over June 2023 and 13% lower year to date.
